# GIVING SOCIETIES

Membership in one of five giving levels recognizes your generous gift to the Annual Diocesan Appeal while remembering those who have gone before us in our history in North Texas.

**St. Stanislaus Society (\$5,000 and up)** Named for Fort Worth's first parish church at 1212 Throckmorton Street that stood until 1907.


St. Alice Society (\$2,500 to \$4,999) Honors St. Alice Church and School that were replaced by Holy Family Parish as Fort Worth grew to the West. See above right.

St. William Society (\$1,500 to \$2,499) Named for the first parish community in Arlington and evolved into what now is Saint Maria Goretti.

San Patricio Society (\$1,000 to \$1,499) Named for a parish that served Throckmorton until 2001.

#### St. John Society (\$500 to \$999)

Named for a parish in Valley View, Cooke County, that served families of the area until its closing in 2007.



As of September 30, 2017 49.28% of our goal, or \$1,626,196, has been committed by 5,911 families.



On June 14, 1942, a group of 400 Catholic families and clergy gathered for the muchanticipated dedication of Saint Alice Catholic Church by Bishop O'Brien from Chicago. O'Brien was president of the Catholic Church Extension Society, which provided financial assistance for the young church.

# **Parishes achieving goal**
